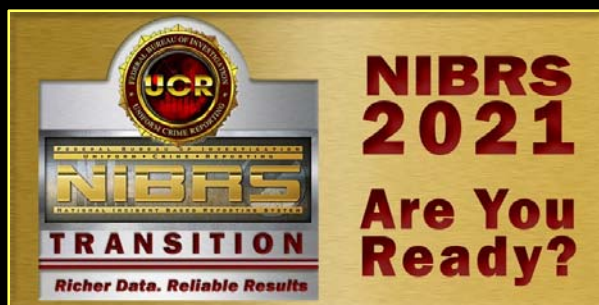

The FBI's UCR Program will transition from Summary (SRS) to National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) in January 2021. Those agencies currently reporting SRS will be required to report on 52 offenses covering more than 50 data elements per offense under NIBRS. Agencies in California have 18 months to prepare for this major change. Analysts will play a critical role in preparing their organizations for this transition.
